Community: Bethalto CUSD #8 is comprised of the incorporated Village of Bethalto and the communities of Meadowbrook, Cottage Hills, Forest Homes and the surrounding rural areas of the northern edge of Illinois Metro East of the greater St. Louis area. The school district is about twenty-two square miles.
